GUIDE TO HOW THE TRUST WORKS

WHO IS ENTITLED TO RECEIVE BENEFITS?

Register of Yinhawangka Beneficiaries

The **Register of Yinhawangka Beneficiaries** (“the Register”) is the register from which the Trustee determines to whom the Trust may make distributions.

It is the Trustee’s responsibility to maintain and update the Register with beneficiaries’ names and their details.

To be added to the Register you must satisfy the three (3) criteria outlined below.

1. You are an eligible Yinhawangka Person

Eligible Yinhawangka People must meet the following criteria:

- i. Listed on the Register of Yinhawangka People (Yinhawangka Native Title Claim); and
- ii. Have attained 18 years of age.
